LIST OF PARISHES OPTING INTO PHASE THREE BARS LOCATED IN THESE PARISHES MAY OPEN

Recently, Governor Edwards announced that Louisiana will enter Phase Three of the roadmap to a resilient Louisiana and allow parishes meeting specific positivity infection criteria to opt in and allow bars to open within the minimum restrictions listed below.

The following parishes have opted into Phase Three and approved to allow bars, breweries, and other Class A-General permit-holders to open for on premise consumption.

❖ **Due to two weeks of >10% positivity rates, Concordia Parish is no longer approved to opt into Phase 3. Effective 10/28/2020.**

Bar, breweries, and other Class A-General establishment located in the above listed parishes may open but must operate within following limits:

- 1) Bars may reopen and offer tableside service only. Standing and bar service will be prohibited.
- 2) Indoor capacity shall be limited to a 25% occupancy rate or fifty (50) people, whichever is less.
- 3) Outdoor capacity shall be limited to fifty (50) people and only for tableside service.
- 4) Tables shall be spaced in accordance with SFM social distancing guidelines.
- 5) Bars, daiquiri shops and other Class AG permit holders must cease all sales and service of alcohol and close no later than 11 P.M.
- 6) No person under the age of twenty-one (21) shall be allowed on to the premises.

- 7) Live music indoor is prohibited.
- 8) Bar games, including but not limited to pool, darts, shuffleboard and cornhole, are prohibited
